

# Documenting a Book

Include the following information and in the following order:

1. Name of person who created it, (if given and relevant), reversed for alphabetizing and followed by a period.
2. Title of the book (underlined).
3. Vol. # if given (followed by a period).
4. The place of publication.
5. Publisher.
6. Year (copyright).

### **D. Four or more authors**

Gatto, Joseph, et al. Exploring Visual Design. 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. Worcester: Davis, 2004.

### **E. Book with editor**

Gates, Henry Louis, Jr., ed. Classic Slave Narratives. New York: Dutton, 2001.
